ASH sign-in on arrival

As the summer holiday season is nearly upon us, now is a good time to remind all campers that they are all required to register at the office upon arrival. We must also have a departure date, even if it is just an estimated one. There are two reasons for this:

1. It is a legal requirement for us to have names and arrival/departure dates for all campers, as per the Camping Grounds Legislation 1985 section 10 clause 1. This is also stated in your ASH agreement in rule 25: "The Camp Ground is subject to

the Reserves Act 1977 and the Camping Ground Regulations 1985. A breach of any of these enactments by a Camper is a breach of these Rules"

2. Management need to know exactly who is here on site at any given time in case of a major emergency and for operational purposes.

We kindly ask for your cooperation in abiding by this rule. There is now a sign- in drop box outside reception which enables campers to sign in outside of office hours.

ASH Fee for the 2013/2014 year has been set at \$4000 for a standard site
